In the new house, the supernatural activity continues, with Renee seeing the ghostly figure of a small child. Josh's mother, Lorraine, arrives and says she has a dark figure in Dalton's room. Suddenly she sees the same dark figure - a monstrous red-faced demon standing behind Josh. Immediately after that, Dalton's room was looted by invisible forces. Lorraine calls Eliza Rainier, a psychic, and paranormal investigators Specs and Tucker. Eliza feels the presence in the house and at the entrance to Dalton's room sees the same demonic, red-faced figure as Lorraine. Eliza explains that Dalton is not in a coma; he was born with the ability to mentally travel to the astral plane, and did so in his sleep, believing that his ability to simply be dreams. He went too far and got lost in a purgatory called The Further, a place inhabited by the tortured souls of the dead. Without his mental presence, Dalton's body appears comatose and spirits can use it to enter the physical world. Josh is skeptical until he realizes that the drawings in Dalton's bedroom hinted at his astral projection abilities and red-faced demon. Eliza performs a session with Dalton. During the session, the demon briefly wields Dalton's body and attacks the group before being stopped by Eliza. Eliza says that her acquaintance with Lorraine has been around for decades, and she previously helped Josh when he was eight years old. Josh also has the ability to astral project, although he suppressed his memory of the ability of the years before with the help of Eliza to protect himself from the parasitic spirit of an evil old woman who wanted to possess it. Dalton inherited this trait from him. Eliza tells Josh that the only way to save Dalton is to move on. Eliza puts Josh in a trance and he is able to project himself on their previous home. He goes to the attic, but he is attacked by the same figures that attacked Renai. After defeating him, Josh enters the Demon's lair, where he finds Dalton chained to the floor. Josh frees him, but they are caught by a demon, while the spirits further invade the real world and terrorize Eliza, Renee and others. After it was possible Josh confronts an old woman who stalked him as a child. The old woman dissolves in the darkness after Josh yells at her to leave him alone. When Josh and Dalton return to their bodies, they wake up in their new home, and the spirits seem to disappear. When they celebrate the obvious end of their ordeal, Eliza starts packing her equipment with Josh when she feels something is wrong. Noticing that Josh's hands look old and dirty, she takes a picture of him. Josh, furious about it, strangles Eliza to death. Renai is terrified when he discovers Eliza's body and searches for Josh. Renee picks up the camera and sees that the image Of Eliza picked up by Josh is an old woman who stalked him as a child, implying that Josh was obsessed. Josh suddenly appears behind Renee and she turns and gasps. The scene after the credits shows an old woman blowing a candle. Wang made his first film, Saw, in 2004, and although he said in an interview with Entertainment Weekly that he was very proud of the film, he also felt that the film, in particular violence and its blood, had taken some people away and made them hesitant to work with it. Thus, Wang made Insidious partly to prove that he can make a film without the level of violence found in the Saw series. Filming of the main photograph for Insidious was completed over three weeks in 2010, from late April to mid-May at the historic Herald Examiner building in downtown Los Angeles. As for the shorter filming schedule, actor Patrick Wilson explained, We had long days and many pages a day and we didn't get a lot of lighting or rehearsals. But fortunately, the advantage of making a movie that isn't on a big budget, and the reason why it's usually done is so, so if the filmmakers feel like: OK, we're not going to sacrifice anything on the screen that I don't think they have, it allows them to have complete control. So we were in good hands. The Music Score by Insidious was written by Joseph Bishara, who also appears in the film as a demon. Performed by the quartet and piano, the bulk of the score was improvised and structured in editing through recording sessions began before filming. Describing the soundtrack's approach to the film, director James Wang explained: We wanted many of these sequences to be very quiet. But, what do I like to do with the soundtrack set you on the edge with a very loud, sort of, atonal spiky violin score, mixing with some really weird piano bangs and pick up, and all of a sudden, you're like, What just happened there? The exclusively digital soundtrack was released by Void Recordings on October 11, 2011. Additional songs featured in the film include : Tiptoe Through the Tulips by Tiny Tim (1968) Nuvole Bianche by Ludovico Einaudi (2004) Decode from Paramore (not listed) Distribution Marketing The first promotional clip from Insidious was released on September 14, 2010. In December of the following year, the production company IM Global released a poster with the image and sales of the film. On January 22, 2011, FilmDistrict released the first teaser trailer for the film. Less than a month later, the theatrical movie trailer was available online through the daily entertainment news site Blastr. The theatrical version of Insidious took place on September 14, 2010 at the Midnight Madness program at the Toronto International Film Festival. Less than 12 hours after its screening, the U.S. distribution rights to the film and worldwide distribution rights to any sequels were picked up by Sony Pictures Worldwide Acquisitions. On December 29, 2010, it was announced that the film would be released theatrically on April 1, 2011 by the then relatively new film company FilmDistrict. The film was also shown on South by Southwest in mid-March 2011. Home Media Insidious was released on DVD and Blu-ray on July 12, 2011 through Sony Pictures Home Entertainment. Blu-ray bonus content includes three feature films: Horror 101: Exclusive Workshop, On Set With Insidious and Insidious Entities. The day before the film's release, Sony Pictures and Fangoria held a free screening of the film at the Silent Movie Theater in Los Angeles, followed by an interactive AW with director James Wang and screenwriter Lee Wennell. The Box Office Movie reception opened with \$13.3 million, making it #3 at the U.S. box office for Hop and Source Code. With a budget of \$1.5 million, it has since raised a total of \$54 million in the U.S. and \$43 million internationally, a total of \$97 million worldwide. Insidious was one of the most profitable films of 2011 (with Cars 2 with a worldwide profit of \$362 million). Critical Reaction Review Rotten Tomatoes reports that 66% of critics gave the film a positive review based on 175 reviews; average score 5.97/10. Critical consensus: Aside from the shaky final act, the treacherous very scary and very fun-haunted house thrill ride. Roger Ebert gave the film 2 1/2 stars out of 4 and said, It depends on the characters, vile events and mounting fear. This one isn't terrifically good, but moviegoers will get what they expect. A number of negative reviews reported that the second half of the film does not correspond to the development of the first. Mike Hale of The New York Times wrote that the strongest analogue of the second half of Insidious is one that the filmmakers probably haven't tried: it feels like a less poetic version of M. Shyamalan's tale. Similarly, James Berardinelli commented, There is a complaint about Insidious, it is that the second half of the film is unable to live up to the incredibly high standards set in the first half. Ethan Gilsdorf of The Boston Globe wrote that the film starts with a promise, but it's a crazy Insidious train running completely off the rails when the filmmakers go logically, and some of the strange gets explained as a double shot of demonic possession and astral projection. John Anderson of The Wall Street Journal explains: The hat makes the film scary, it's not something that jumps out of the closet. It's something that can jump out of a closet. The blood, blood and noise of so many movies are jitters to miss the terrifying moment: movie watchers are much more convinced instinctively that what we don't know will most surely hurt us... Insidious sets out that these people can make a movie that works on a whole other level, without blood, or obvious gimmicks. And do a flesh scan. Michael Phillips of the Chicago Tribune wrote: Director James Wang and screenwriter Lee Wennell admire all sorts of fears, from blatant to insidious thin. This one lies on an effective halfway between these extremes. Rolling Stone's Peter Travers commented, This is a film about a house spy better than average, mainly because Insidious decides that it can frighten the audience without spraying it with blood.
